Welcome 2021

Do you remember last January when we were all so excited and hopeful for 2020? Who would have guessed that in 3 short months we would be dealing with a once in lifetime world wide pandemic. We CAN'T WAIT to see YOU in 2021!!

In 1918 the Spanish flu was first noted at Ft. Riley, Kansas during WWI and was spread by troop movement both domestically and internationally. There were 3 waves noted with the one in the summer of 1918 being more lethal and social distancing began to be enforced. In the winter and spring of 1919 there was a third wave that seemed to have run its course by summer of 1919. Some researchers actually think there was a fourth wave in the winter of 1920.

Who would have thought we would all know about social distancing in 2020? The reason that Covid 19 has been so hard to figure out is because nothing like this has been seen in over 100 years! When you have a novel (new) virus it takes time to figure things out. While none of us like wearing masks, it is important to do so. It is a way to protect yourself and to protect others. It is a simple easy way to decrease the spread. Social distancing is a little tougher. We are social creatures, we do not like to be alone. It is important at this time that we not let up on the guidance the medical community is giving us. Community spread has increased, what can you do to help us keep those who we really need, working?

- ⇒ Wear your mask <u>over your nose</u>, mouth and chin anytime your are with someone who does not live with you.
- \Rightarrow Stay 6 feet away from those who live outside of your household
- ⇒ Only visit in groups of 8-10 people from your 'bubble'
- ⇒ Wash your hands, wash your hands, wash your hands (use sanitizer if water is unavailable but wash as soon as your return home)



\Rightarrow Don't touch your face


If you or a household member has Covid 19 no disconnect order is needed!


