The Defiance Township Trustees met in regular session at the Defiance County Commissioners building – 2nd Floor conference room, 500 Court Street, in Defiance Township, Defiance, Ohio, on Tuesday, June 22nd, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. Answering as present were Dan Peck, Diane Mayer & Jason Shaffer, with all three (3) members of the BOARD OF TRUSTEES having answered the roll, a quorum was declared.

- b) Zoning Bd. of Appeals met at 6p. 4-27
 - A request for a "conditional use" permit for the construction of a new home on parcel B11-0014-0-001-03, of approximately 5.4 acres of Defiance Township currently zoned "agricultural" had been made by Christopher and Julie Stack. The parcel is located in Def. Twp. section 14 in the NE corner of the NE quarter section, Twp 3 North range 4 east split from parcel B11-1400-001-00 with an issued house number of 23870.
 - ii) The Zoning Bd approved the request.
- c) The fiscal officer reported that Theodore & Diana Walbolt of 12128 Fairway Winds Court, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46814 has requested a conditional use permit for the purpose of construction of a home on Def. Twp. Parcel B11-0016-0-015-2 split. The Appeals Bd will meet July 27the 6p – 500 Court St. 2nd floor conference room to decide the request.
- d) The Chair asked if there were any other zoning issues to come before the Board.
 - i) None were presented.

- a) Comments or concerns from Twp employees/Trustees on current or proposed new eq &/or safety items.
 - i) Mr. Shaffer stated the Twp Operator Steve Buchholtz had stated that if the Trustees approved to put an insert dump bed on the 2019 GMC, this unit would be much more useful for Twp. Operations. It was noted that as presently configured the unit is limited to pulling a trailer, If an inserted dump bed was installed the unit could be used for other road work such as snow removal patching and berming.
 - ii) Buchholtz stated he had spokine with City personnel as the City has several similar trucks with inserted dump beds. All comments were positive.
 - iii) Buchholtz said the price would probably be around \$5k.

Mrs. Mayer moved that the Twp purchase an insert dump bed for thye Twp's 2019 GMC 3 quarter ton truck. Mr. Peck seconded

 - i) Discussion of June review:
 - (1) Mayer stated road looked good and crew was to continue mowing and berming as necessary.
 - (a) Railing was approved to mow roads as he sees when necessary.
 - (2) Railing was recognized and stated there were tree branches hanging over the road at Garman and Krouse.
 - (a) Buchholtz and Railing will check and determine if they can trim back. If not then Trustees will contact the Co. Engineer's for assistance on this issue.

- (3) Railing also noted that a hole at the end of Ball and Krouse road was patched with cold patch. He thought is might eventually reappear due to traffic and thinks a more permanent solution might be desired.
 - (a) Trustees stated that when this again is an issue they will contact the engineer for assistance.
