- b) Zoning Bd. of Appeals met at 6p. 7-27
 - i) A request for a "conditional use" permit for the construction of a new home on parcel B11-0016-0-015-03, of approximately 5 acres of Defiance Township currently zoned "agricultural" has been made by Theodore & Diana Walbolt. The parcel is located in Def. Twp. section 16 in the NE quarter section, Twp 3 North range 4 east split from parcel B11-1600-0-015-02 with an issued house number of 15190.
 - (1) The Zoning Bd approved the request.
- c) Steve Buchholtz was recognized, he stated that he believes a nuisance issue exists on a Hammersmith rd property on which is a house trailer. He noted there are high weeds and grass and what appears to be an abandoned couch.
 - i) Zoning Nuisance officer Diemer will investigate.
 - ii) The Chair asked if there were any other zoning issues to come before the Board.

 - iii) A second quote was requested from W. A. Jone eq of Columbia City, Indiana the Twp did not receive this quote.
 - (1) Per Buchholtz a verbal quote was given of \$3,600 the Twp never rec'd a written quote.
 - iv) During July Trustees determined to purchase the dump bed from Kalida Truck.

- (3) It was reported that in July stone was added to May road and was graded using the Delaware Twp grader. The grader has been returned to Delaware Twp.
- c) Re-build Ginter/Carter Rd. from Jefferson Ave. (St. Rt 66) to at Carter Rd to Ginter and Jefferson (St. Rt 66)see mins from Jan 2020 forward for details.
 - i) At the April 2021 Twp session the issue was brought forth from the table:
 - ii) Mr. Peck reported that the City will soon be forthcoming with a proposal for a joint venture to widen and add a sidewalk to this road which will include that portion of the road that belongs to the Twp.

- d) 2021 financial impact review by the fiscal officer:
 - i) The fiscal officer reported:
 - (1) Total road fund revenues year date are(2) Total road fund expenses year to date are\$150,796\$96,351
 - (a) Road salt purchased 2021- total \$5,460
 - i) Anticipated road funds revenue for 2021 based on the January 8th, 2021 1st Twp amended certificate was:
 - (1) \$208,350 more or less
 - ii) Anticipated expenses for 2021 as of this session:
 - (1) Regular twp. expenses anticipated for the year, baring emergencies. The estimate for 2021 based on historical review, is placed at between \$70,000 and \$100,000 would include Twp projects estimated or completed so far this year.:
 - (2) \$48k as of this session for Co Eng work- in 2021 refer to item 6-1 of the April 2021 agenda (other than Bowman Rd. rebuild).
 - (3) \$120,250 refer to exhibit 6-1 of this session Bowman Rd. rebuild -
 - (4) ??? savings towards the Carter/Ginter rd project.
 - ii) Total estimated expenses from Twp rd acc'ts for 2021 \$230k to \$269 if projects currently proposed are completed and Twp reg expense is 100k.
- e) A recap of the OPWC grants see minutes of previous sessions for history. An update was last received from the Co Engineer's Office dated 01-07-2021 (exhibit 6-f) part of annual public officials meeting held in Feb.
 - i) Current status as reported by the fiscal officer
 - (1) –OPWC grant work for 2021- no known activity as of this session.
 - (a) The amount of OPWC grant funds spent on the Twp's behalf in 2021 –none as of this session.
 - (b) The amount of funds for Twp. use is \$52,332.42 plus remaining grants over the next 4 years.
 - (c) <u>Trustees are reminded that there is no longer a discount in effect from the Co. Engineer for work done on the Twp's behalf by Engineer staff.</u> Use of funds is 100%.
 - ii) The Engineer had previously informed the Trustees that with the passage of issue 1 several years ago the law promises the grants. The average annual grant for Def Twp. is \$25k for the next 4 years or a total of \$100k remaining give or take.
 - iii) As of this session:

- (1) Trustees stated their intent is to use OPWC grant funds for the Twp's portion of the Ginter rd project noted above.
- f) The Chair asked if there was any other discussion regarding the fiscal impact report or other road issues?
 - i) There was none.

- i) At the June 22nd meeting, Steve Buchholtz stated there was a large dead tree in Taylor cemetery that needed trimmed of dead branches which might fall and damage tombstones.

 - (1) Def. Twp. has no such agreement on file.
 - (2) Auglaize Twp Trustees wish to discuss a drainage issue and other possible maintenance items such as snow removal and mowing.
 - (1) Auglaize Trustee Widenhammer stated there is presently a drainage issue on this road and that Auglaize two has been moving both sides of the road.
 - (a) Def. Twp noted its operators have also mowed and plowed both sides of the road.
 - (2) the Auglaize Trustees state that it might be beneficial if there was a written agreement which would state the responsibilities of each Twp on what portion and what types of maintenance would be done.
 - (3) All Trustees of Auglaize and Defiance Township agreed that a written maintenance agreement was desirable. Further, all Trustees agreed that Auglaize Twp Trustees would have such an agreement prepared by their County Prosecutor. The agreement would be provided to Defiance Twp Trustees and Def. Trustees stated that they would have the Defiance Co. Prosecutor review.
 - (a) If Defiance Twp desired edits to the Auglaize document these edits would be made and the revised document would be sent to the Auglaize Trustees for review and comments.
 - (4) Defiance Twp. Trustees thanked the Auglize Twp Trustees for the effort on this issue.
- ii) The Chair asked if there was any other old business for discussion.
